Having grown up in an era where low-income families, like my own, had very limited public-school options, I have long championed greater access and opportunities for school choice. As my career advanced, I sought greater input through school leadership. During this time, the charter school movement had taken hold. I recognized charters as the first bold step in school choice and joined the Noble Network in its efforts during the spring of 2006 where I helped to open Pritzker College Prep, a Noble Charter School.

In August of 2010, I moved to New Orleans to work with Firstline Schools to help the rebirth of the lowest-performing high school in the state at the time. I became the Principal of J.S. Clark High School where I was recognized with the highest gains in one year. My eighteen years in school leadership included conceptualizing and serving as the founding Dean of Students for Noble's Pritzker College Prep (rated #2 in Chicago Public High Schools by Chicago Magazine). During this time, I have also overseen the opening of two charter high schools, and I started a vocational program at Clark High School and consulted with many others school as well. I have dedicated myself to delivering on the promise of multi-generational change on a larger scale. The common thread throughout my career has been my entrepreneurial ability to conceptualize and bring to fruition schools and programs designed to bring greater access to toptier educational opportunities for underserved communities. I have a Master's Degree in Organizational Leadership and B.A. in Psychology from Lewis University.
